PRE-ARRANGED/PLANNED ABSENCE FORM

School Board policy affords to parents the opportunity to take students out of school for <u>family trips</u> or <u>other special circumstances</u>. Although parents are urged to virtually eliminate these types of absences due to the negative impact they may have on their son or daughter's academic achievement, the school does realize that school schedules do not always match up with parental schedules, and that exigent circumstances do arise from time to time.

Parents wishing to take students out of school for these types of absences are ask to complete this form. The student then needs to get their teachers approval and to return the form to the office at least 3 SCHOOL DAYS in advance of the date they will be absent. Specific details about the family trip or special circumstance must accompany the request. If this absence appears to be excused and the student is in good behavioral standing and has an acceptable attendance record to date, he/she will be issued a Pre-Arranged Absence Form to have either approved or disapproved by all of his/her teachers. If all of the student's teachers approve of the absence it will be excused in full. However, if any of the student's teachers disapprove of the absence, the student will have the absence marked as unexcused for those periods where disapproved. Students are expected to make arrangements with their teachers prior to the absence for all make-up work.
