



MBA Recruiting Cover Letter Guide and Student Examples

Graduate Business Career Development

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This guide contains a few important reminders for cover letters as well as some actual student samples. It is intended to accompany the associated Career Leadership Personal Branding video.

Though names have been changed, the following pages contain actual student cover letter examples that were volunteered by students who have gone before you. Career Development does not represent that these are perfect letters; the reality is, there is no such thing as a “perfect” cover letter.

A better way to describe these letters is that they were “successful” letters in the sense that, along with their accompanying resumes, they generally achieved the goal of, at least, garnering an interview, with many of these outreaches culminating in job offers.

This collection provides a strong sample of cover letters that represent a diversity of styles, experiences, and voice. Yet, each of them contains the core elements of successful cover letters.

We hope you find these examples helpful as you work on your own cover letters. You are, of course, encouraged to work with your career coach if you would benefit from a tailor resume and/or cover letter review for applications you are undertaking – particularly early on in your tenure.

Excellent Cover Letter Structure and Hygiene*

1. Include 5 Paragraphs

A great cover letter should include these five components:

An Introduction

The introduction should be a short paragraph that gives a brief overview of your background, the position you are applying for, and gives an overview of the skills you'll highlight through the rest of the letter.

Two Paragraphs That Tell Two Stories

Each story should highlight your ability to drive impact by solving a specific problem. Start your story by sharing the context of the problem you faced, then talk about the specific actions you took, and finally end with the results you achieved. Focus one story on your hard (read: analytical) skills, and one on your soft (ex: leadership) skills. These stories could also take the form of a series of bullets as the cover letter examples below illustrate.

Why You're A Good Fit For X Firm

This is where you tailor your cover letter to the specific firm you're targeting. This 4th paragraph of your cover letter should reference at least one person at the firm with whom you've spoken (if at all possible), and expound upon what you learned about the firm in that conversation that draws you to apply. Don't focus on what you'll get out of the experience. Focus on how you know you'll be a good cultural fit. The only credible way to communicate this is by having talked to someone at the firm (and ideally the offices you're targeting).

Conclusion

Tie your previous professional experiences and extracurriculars together to reinforce why you'll be a great consultant. End by thanking the reader for their time and consideration.

2. Use Anecdotes and Details

Avoid sounding generic with the descriptions of your past experiences. Details will help you stand out amongst the sea of candidates.

For instance, here's a bad example: "My previous experiences and projects have given me a strong set of leadership skills."

Instead, say something like: "As a Business Development Analyst at Facebook, I led a team of five on an internal initiative that reduced our group's budget by 25% over one quarter. Convincing key stakeholders to reduce their own budget for the sake of the greater good was not easy, but the project sharpened my ability to overcome conflicts and arrive at consensus."

3. Keep It To One Page

Going over 1 page is the cardinal sin of cover letters. Anything longer than one page will be automatically discarded. Your cover letter should demonstrate that you're able to communicate in a concise manner. Firms receive a lot of cover letters, so the last thing they want to read is your entire life story. Keep your cover letter to one page, max.

The cover letter is the time for you to conduct a deeper dive into your 2-3 most impressive stories. Instead of explaining why you're such a great fit and the passion you have for the role, pick and choose your strongest set of experiences and bring them to light. These stories are a lot more effective at driving home your point that you will be a great fit. Don't be arrogant, however, How do you know if you are? You talk about how much better you are than others at this skill or that ability – be honest about your skills,, but don't compare yourself to others.

4. Do Your Research

Your cover letters will become stronger and stronger over time as you speak with more people in your chosen pathway. By networking with current alums at the level you are applying for, you'll figure out which firm and office are the best fit for you. You'll also gain nuanced knowledge about your chosen

pathway that you just can't get from online searches. **Generic cover letters just won't do.**

5. Use a Personal Tone

Your cover letter should adeptly showcase your unique skills and personality. This is one reason why using a generic cover letter will get you into trouble.

Remember that no one has your story except you. Own it, and never apologize for or focus on the negative aspects of your experience.

6. Get Your Cover Letter Reviewed by Others

Ask people you trust to review your cover letter in order to receive advice and suggestions. Ideally, your reviewers should be people who have previous experience in your field of choice. Sometimes, even when you proofread multiple times, you will miss mistakes that others catch in their first reads. More importantly, they might be able to suggest edits that strengthen your letter to make it stand out.

7. Submit and Send as a PDF

The last thing you want is for all your hard work to be ruined by computer formatting errors. Whether you are sending your cover letter for networking or submitting it for an application, make sure your cover letter is in PDF format. Sending in the file type (i.e., Microsoft Word or Pages) in which you created the cover letter is risky for two reasons. First, many will be looking at your cover letter on their smartphones, and most non-PDF files will ruin the formatting structure you have put into place. Second, even on desktop, if the cover letter reviewer doesn't have the program you used or the same version, you can run into formatting issues. Or worse, they may not be able to open the file at all. The extra step is worth it, and it's best practice to send documents as PDFs.

8. Double, Triple, Quadruple Check before Submitting

In Summary

Remember:

- Introduce yourself to an organization and demonstrate your interest in the company/role
- Highlight key skills you bring to the table; what figurative dragons have you slayed in your past experience?
- *Motivate the reader to read your resume... which, hopefully, will get you the interview*
- Your cover letter must be tailored to...
 - The needs of the company
 - The requirements of the role
- Each cover letter you write should be unique
 - Specific company/role
 - Proof that you've done your homework
 - Curated set of experiences/skills
- Don't write a generic letter as a way to save time
 - *If your letter applies to many different companies/roles by simply a "change all" of the company name, that's a sign of a poorly written cover letter, and recruiters will see right through it.*
- Why Them
- Why you are writing
- Why you are interested in the company and the role (don't be generic)
- Why You
 - Who you are/your pitch (student status, key strengths)
 - What qualifications you bring to the position
 - Specific examples that "prove" you've got the goods
- Desired Next Steps
 - What you want to happen next (e.g., an opportunity to further discuss your qualifications, an interview, etc.)

This included daily contact with clients to communicate complex contractual covenants as well as financial royalty calculations. In this way, I not only had to explain qualitative information, but also quantitative formulas and figures.
