Admission Requirements

Before applying to the program, students are encouraged to consult with an advisor in the School of Business Student Services Office to discuss the application process and plan a program of study.

To be admitted to the Bachelor of Science in business administration, students must:

Apply for admission and be accepted into the School of Business.
 Students who are not accepted into a program will not be allowed to enroll in 300- or 400- level business courses, and will not be eligible to declare a major in business administration.

Application Deadlines

- Summer Term and Fall Semester: March 1
- Spring Semester: October 1

Graduation Requirements

- Cumulative SIUE GPA required: 2.25
- Business GPA required (in all required business courses taken at SIUE): 2.25
- C or higher in Management 441 (University Senior Assignment)
- C or higher in courses marked with * in the Degree Requirements section of the catalog
- Other specialization GPA requirements apply as listed in the Degree Requirements section of the catalog
- Students must complete all 300- and 400-level business course requirements at SIUE or another AACSB-accredited business school. Once admitted to the School of Business, students seeking a major or minor in the School of Business must obtain prior approval from the School of Business before taking upper-level (300- or 400-level) business coursework at another institution that is intended to satisfy a major or minor requirement.
